Hi Everyone!

July went skidding bye in a hurry. I was leading an out of town group on the Cancer Run July 15th. We had been through Branched Oak Lake, Ceresco, Louisville & Ashland & was returning through Lincoln where I was making a right turn from Cornhusker Hwy onto Superior Street. I had a green light, was avoiding some small debris when in the middle of the turn it laid over on it's side & slid over the inside lane up to the median. I was dumped off in the outside lane on my right side & slid a few feet, tearing my jeans & breaking in my leather jacket. (Which I was considering taking off because it was 100 degrees out). Upon further investigation oil was found on the front tire. I believe it was deposited onto one of those oversize crosswalk rectangles (which look slippery anyway) & was hard to spot because it was clear (hydraulic oil?). While I was checking to see if all my parts were attached & in working order (no red spots) the guys following got parked & helped get the bike into a sunny side up position. I got on & rode off to the finish point (taking the corners very carefully). I prefer to wear off cowhide than my hide. I have a very small mark on my leg, then a big purple patch later & now it's almost gone. The Wing got a new rear crash guard & a highway peg mount part is on the way for up front. No orange plastic was damaged in this test of the crash bars.

Ken has graded the tests you took at a previous meeting. Patches are here tonight.
